



Happy New Year!


I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone at JCI Queensway a very happy and prosperous new year.


Grow & Glow Series - Queensway Wellness

An interview with Ankie Beilke

Humble beginnings:

Yoga was not always present within Ankie Beilke's life plans as one might think. During her university years, she began as an art student taking courses in New York. However, during the course of her studies, she began feeling stressed and overwhelmed by her workload. This eventually leaked into her life outside of school and started affecting her mood and relationships. This was the prelude that would lead her into what she described as “a change to my whole lifestyle”.

Ankie was first introduced to yoga by one of her friends who saw the strain that stress is causing in her life. However, at first, Ankie was reluctant in trying this new form of exercise, stating it to be unnecessary and doubting its effectiveness. Nonetheless, her friend continued to encourage Ankie to give yoga a chance, to the point where as a birthday present one year, this friend gifted 3 yoga lessons to Ankie. To finally stop the pestering of her friend, she agreed to attend a yoga class, and then another one after that, and again after that. Yoga, since then, has become an inseparable part of her life.




Early year impacts:

The changes were slow, but clear in their effects on her life after that day. “...Much calmer and much happier” was how Ankie described the benefits that yoga had on her life early on. Described as a change to her entire lifestyle from that moment on, not only was she more fit physically, but her mentality got a huge boost also: she was no longer letting her stress affect the other parts of her life.

The momentum that yoga brought to Ankie's life cascaded down from only physical and mental exercises to her daily consumptions. Building upon her initial interest in cooking, she started to create a menu for fresh, whole foods to complement her healthier lifestyle. It's not only what you do, but also what you eat that defines how well you live.

Furthermore, through further exploration into yoga and meditation, Ankie was able to conceive another important lesson that helped her greatly reduce her everyday tension: minimalization. Fewer material possessions, less concern about external opinions, and be more connected with one's own natural aspects. Yoga is a whole lifestyle that you must embrace wholeheartedly or else it would not have an effective or lasting impact.



Journey into Becoming a Yoga Teacher:

History doesn't repeat is a popular saying, but in Ankie's case, this was not the case. Even though yoga has gradually become a defining character of her early adulthood, Ankie never considered in becoming a yoga instructor. Even though she forced many of her friends and family to follow her to attend yoga classes, Ankie never considered teaching these classes herself instead. Because why would she? Coming from an art background and already stressing from University courses, taking a degree in teaching never occurred to her as a viable path.





Self-doubt again stopped Ankie from pushing forward with yoga, and again it was her friends who gave her the nudge to carry on. Ankie's initial reasoning for taking her teacher training was to learn more about yoga and help her friends and family get better. But like any princess meets prince story (without the prince), she instantly fell in love with teaching when she felt the goodness and happiness of seeing how her classes brought benefits to her students.

"What I love the most about teaching is when people start doing things that they never thought they could do before."




Ankie then recounted a success story from early on of a student who had never done a headstand or different yoga poses before and doubted that they could ever do them. Within only a month, that same student was proudly doing one without help. Through the right teachings and encouragements, Ankie believes that anyone can learn to do a headstand (or at least if she's the one who's teaching).

Negative thoughts cloud your head most of the time especially with the advancements and popularity of social media, and these greatly reduces your perception of your own abilities. But as long as you keep a positive mind, you will see that the possibilities are endless! The satisfaction of seeing her students excitement at the realization of their capabilities, is but another reason that Ankie continues teaching yoga to this day.



Present Day:

Ankie now has her own studio and teaches a variety of types of yoga. To name a few include Vinyasa, hot yoga, yin yang yoga, and restorative yoga. One of the style of yoga that's personal to Ankie are her lessons targeting pregnant women. She described her time while she was pregnant and how yoga helped her power through some of the toughest months in her life. Before her experience, she was the type that goes to 3 yoga classes a day in addition to her regular schedule. However, while she got pregnant, this special style of yoga: the breathing exercises and different laying poses, achieved in slowing down her rhythm and improved her connection with her own body. And now she can use this particular experience to help out other soon-to-be mothers through relaxation and mindfulness.



Words to Those Starting Out:

The greatest challenge that those first starting out with yoga is that they will feel that all the poses feel different every new day that you do them. One day you may feel great and believe that you are doing the poses perfectly, while the next day you may feel extremely tight. Either way, you are correct. Your feeling is greatly affected by many factors such as: what you did that day, how well you slept the previous night, or even what you ate that morning. All these things I have struggled with daily and everyday it's different. But you should accept these differences because that is life. Do not let these struggles cause self-doubt in your abilities. What my years being involved with different aspects of yoga is that "Yoga is a whole lifestyle. By embracing the entire lifestyle, you will see your life changing for the better."

JCI World Debating Championship

My team made it to the finals of the JCI World Debating Championship!

In the 2022 Junior Chamber International (JCI) World Congress Hong Kong, I attended the selection interview and represented JCI Hong Kong in the JCI World Debating Championship.

I had the opportunities to work with 2 dedicated teammates Jacqueline Yeung from JCI City Lady and Jeffery Leung from JCI Victoria. We worked through days and nights to brainstorm ideas and find information on 10 motions which were sent to us a few days before the debate competition. Most importantly, we have successfully entered the final round of the debate competition and competed with top debate teams from around the world on 3rd November, 2022!

My debate experiences in JCI Hong Kong began in the JCI World Public Speaking and Debating Championship (Hong Kong Selection) 2021 which was co-hosted by JCI Lion Rock and JCI Queensway. The competition format was similar to the JCI World Congress Debating Championship. We were given 10 motions on topics that address global issues. This helped me to become familiar with the JCI debating style and improve my critical thinking skills.

In order to recruit JCI Hong Kong English debate team members for the JCI World Debating Championship, members were invited to attend the selection interview at the end of September. With the aim to improve my debating skills and gain more relevant experiences, I grasped the chance to represent JCI Hong Kong in the JCI World Debating Championship. After the formation of the debate team, we had different training sessions including counter skills, debate concept, argument structure and debate rules. The training not only helped me improve my skills, but we also met members from other JCI Hong Kong chapters with common interests.

Speaking structure

The call on whether to speak for or against takes place before the motion is announced. Each team member shall have 2 or 3 minutes to develop and present the position of their team; either for or against. The speaking order is as follow:

Team Captain For: 2 minutes	1st Speaker For: 3 minutes	2nd Speaker For: 3 minutes	Team Captain Against: 2 minutes
Team Captain Against: 2 minutes	1st Speaker Against: 3 minutes	2nd Speaker Against: 3 minutes	Team Captain For: 2 minutes

Debate rules

Teams will be notified of their motion before the start of the debate. The first team drawn or the first team through to successive rounds will debate on the for side of the motion. Points are deducted when a speaker goes over or under the allotted time, i.e. 1-point is deducted for every second that a speaker exceeds or falls short of the ten-second buffer period.

Debate glossary

1. Timeouts

Each team is allowed one 60 second timeout during the debate. A timeout may only be called between speakers, immediately after a speaker has finished delivering their arguments and has stepped back from the podium. Team Captains must indicate to the Chairperson that their team wishes to use a timeout. The Timekeeper will inform the team when their 60 seconds are up.

2. Points of Information

Points of Information are for speakers to clarify an argument made during the debate competition. Only participating speakers can present a point of information. A speaker may refuse your point by saying "no thank you" or indicating with a gesture. If they refuse to yield to the floor, return to your seat. When the speaker indicates they will listen to your point, deliver it clearly and briefly, then return to your seat. There will be no conversation.
