Keep up your phenomenal work. I cannot wait to see the progress you will continue to make in Hong Kong!












# **ORGANIZATION CHART OF JCI Queensway 2023**

# Cover Story An Interview with Woo Fung You're known as the "Evergreen Tree" in the entertainment industry and you have

You're known as the "Evergreen Tree" in the entertainment industry and you have always been passionate about the industry. As we know, you just held your concert at the end of last year and also won the Hong Kong Film Awards – Lifetime Achievement Award this year. However, we know that your family owned a business, and wanted you to continue the business. How did you get into the industry in the beginning and why?

Sau gor: In fact, I myself have a very strong interest in acting. Back then, when I saw a company held a training class for acting, I just went for it. My family members were against it in the beginning because the income from performing arts would not be stable and my family members felt that this industry was too "colorful" and might not be so suitable for me. Of course, my family also hoped that I would take over the family business, but then I firmly wanted to start my career in this industry, and I have been doing it until now.

After giving up continuing the family business and applying for the entertainment industry, did you face opposition from

time? Young people nowadays often have their own dreams, but family members may not understand much. Do you have any suggestions for the young people to better communicate with their family members when pursuing their dreams?

your family members and how did you communicate with your family members at that

Sau gor: At first, my family didn't know about it, but in the end, after the company hired me, I told them this piece of news. At that time, I was determined to go my own way, and I had confidence in myself while the company was willing to invest on me as well. Therefore, I entered the industry.

I strongly believe that parents nowadays are also very supportive, so I believe that as long as young people are willing to do well, their families will definitely support them. Young people might only need to work hard and keep a firm heart when chasing their dreams.









During one of your interviews, you mentioned that it was the first time for you to enter the set for the filming of "Men's Hearts" in 1953. You were so worried about your performance and how did you overcome your fears. How do you suggest the young people to get out of their comfort zone and encourage them to move forward?

Sau gor: When I entered the movie set at the very first time, I was indeed a bit worried. However, I thought at the time that I just had to do as usual, read the script well, and work hard to overcome my inner fears. I believe that it is just a psychological effect for most of the time and actually there is nothing to worry too much. Therefore, it is also a good practice for the young people to explore and try more.

You experienced the transition from dialogue films and literary films to musical films. Just as the times are changing rapidly now, people's lives and technology are also changing more rapidly than before. Based on your experience, how should we adapt to the changes?

Sau gor: Yes, the industry and the world are changing so fast. The most important thing is to adapt and adjust yourself. In the past, I just wanted to "entertain myself first, and then others", so I was not too afraid of changes at all.

### Your acting career has exceeded half a century, what is your biggest reward?

Sau gor: Yes I have been in this industry for more than half a century, and my greatest achievement is that I have met so many good actors and friends here.



Till now, you have filmed for more than 300 movies, more than 80 TV series, and held 5 concerts in the Hong Kong Coliseum. What keeps you so enthusiastic?

Sau gor: As I have shared with you just now, "entertaining myself first and then entertaining others" is always my purpose. And of course, as I also put in a lot of effort myself, together with the right time, place and people, I have been working well until now.

### Could you please share with us the most memorable turning point in your life? How did you face this challenge?

Sau gor: In 1964, my workload began to decrease, and then I just made a decision, that was if there were any roles for the films, I was willing to try. Today, when I look back, this decision made me who I am today.

### Finally, could you please share with us the thing that you want to do the most right now?

Sau gor: I am not going to share this with you now, but I believe that this will be successful, and everyone will know this piece of good news very soon. Please stay tuned. Thank you so much!









# **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

Community Flagship Project "Wheels Be Your Friends 2023"





As society continues to age, many elderly individuals require the use of wheelchairs, while people with disabilities rely on wheelchairs for mobility. In order to promote and establish a more inclusive, friendly, and barrier-free society, we launched the "Wheels Be Your Friends 2023" with three major events.

From May to June, a survey was conducted, interviewing wheelchair users (including people with disabilities and the elderly) and their caregivers, as well as the public, to explore the current situation and difficulties faced by wheelchair users in terms of hardware and software for travel. We also conducted on-site visits in Kwun Tong,



an old district, to assess the accessibility of street level shops and establishments. Survey results were announced on 25th June, and the press release was supported by Guests of Honor Hon TANG Ka-piu, BBS, JP, and Chairperson of Equal Opportunities Commission Mr CHU Man-kin, Ricky, I.D.S. We were delighted to have received coverage on over 17 media outlets and newspapers including the front page of Wenweipo, as well as interviews on special programs in TVB and RTHK. TVB and other NGOs also conducted similar studies in the following months.

Inclusive Circle Painting Workshop - second event of the project - was successfully held on 29th July. The event was full house with over 100 attendees including Seniors and teeangers from Kwun Tong district, intellectual disabled, and wheelchair users. Participants use their creativity to create their own painting using circles and simple patterns, which were then put together to form a unique yet harmonious piece of large artwork. Through this event, we hope to gather different members of the society together to engage in communication and mutual understanding, thus social integration of not only wheelchair users but other vulnerable groups. We are pleased to receive positive feedback from participants who enjoyed the event and would like to join similar workshops in the future.

Kayaking experience

Cum closing ceremony

was held on 13 August in Chinese

Y.M.C.A. Wu Kwai Sha Youth Village. More
than 20 participants joined the kayaking experience.

It is our pleasure to have JCI Hong Kong National
President Elect Senator Ben Mak with us that morning.

Participants were blindfolded or have one arm tied up
when kayaking to experience the difficulties faced by
physically challenged people. Through this experience,
participants have learnt to put oneself in other's shoes

and increased their sense of empathy.















Spanning May to August, JCI Queensway Community Development flagship project Wheels Be Your Friends 2023 held three events – press release, circle painting and kayak – that aim to raise awareness towards wheelchair users' difficulties to the public and to local community. With utter surprise and delight, this project was awarded Best New Project 2023 during JCIHK National Convention in late September. This was indeed great encouragement to the efforts put by the project team and recognition of the impact our survey has brought to the society.







# **COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

**JCI Queensway Volunteer Group** 



This year the Community Development team initiated the QJC Volunteer Group, with the aim to increase member's engagement and as a means of member recruitment.

In February, we joined a food collection and distribution event in Yuen Long. Over two weekends, volunteers collected hundreds of unsold bread from local bakeries, slightly damaged fruit from fruit stalls and distributed them to low-income elderlies and homeless individuals. The event was a great success, with over 100 individuals receiving bread. The event not only saves food that would have been otherwise disposed of, provided food to those in need, but also

taught our volunteers about poverty in our community and to cherish what we have.



In March, we joined an art project organised for children with dementia. The event aimed to provide a creative outlet for children with dementia. The volunteers worked with the children to create a large artwork using a variety of materials, such as paint, markers, and their hands. The finished piece was exhibited which was covered by the press. The event not only provided an opportunity for children to engage in a fun activity, but also raised awareness about dementia and the challenges that families face when caring for loved ones with this condition.

In May, a group of volunteers visited low-income families to provide support and assistance. The volunteers provided food and other essential items to families who may be struggling to make ends meet. The visits were a great success, with families expressing gratitude for the support they received. The event not only provided much-needed assistance to families but also helped to build a sense of community and showed that people care about each other.

Overall, these events demonstrate the importance of community involvement and the impact

that can be made when people come together to help others. Supported by positive feedbacks, CD team will continue to seek different volunteering opportunities for our members.



# INTERVIEW WITH SPONSOR

JCI Hong Kong National President Senator Kenneth Yu

### O: What made you set up "Sense"? And what does "Sense" mean?

NP: I first worked as a social worker in 2005. When I took on the role of youth work, I found that doing trainings and working for young people sounded more interesting to me. Therefore, I started to do trainings. However, the difficulty for me was that there was something you wanted to do, but you may not be able to achieve them under the framework as there were too many rules. And in 2009, we started a musical performance about anti-drugs. At that time, we found a group of marginalized youths, about 30 to 40 of them, and we did trainings with them so that they could participate in our musical performance on the stage. In the end, the response was very good, and the director also had a lot of deep feelings.

It was this musical performance that made me not to continue working as a social worker. At the same time, I started to study at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University and was ready to change my career. Later, by chance, my friend and a member of JCI Harbor encouraged me to join JCI. In the end, I started a business with this friend and founded "Keen". After that, we hope that the company can use the courage to train others so that everyone can grow in different experiences. Thus, we changed our name from "Keen" to "Sense" and this has been established since 2012.



### **Q**: What was the thing that touched you the most?

NP: I remember that there was a young people becoming our student since he was in his university studies. He has been helping us to lead groups and teach some training theories and foundations. You might ask why he impressed me so deeply and it's because of his enthusiasm. He didn't know how to do trainings in the beginning but then he started to embark on the journey of being a trainer. That's what I was really touched. It was just a pity that he finally decided to leave our city so he had to leave the company as well.

# Q: As the National President of JCI Hong Kong this year, you have a lot of liaison work with the government this year. Do you think our status has improved in the government's mind?



NP: The government knows a lot about us because they have cooperated with us like "good friends" in the past. They kept supporting our activities and were willing to be our guest of honor. After the pandemic, we started to have even closer cooperation with the government, let them clearly know that we are an international organization for the young active citizens and we have a group of young people who are capable, responsible and have international perspectives. In addition, they understand that our organization is an international one and we have 104 locations working together. This network also allows us to achieve a greater impact on the society and even the world as well.

The above two points are the key points that we hope to let the government know. This year we just had a trip to Beijing so the government could see that we could achieve something that the government wants to achieve. For example, we would tell the story of Hong Kong well, and hope that through these processes, our influence can have a positive impact on the world related to our theme "Lead to Impact".

. Q: Please rate from 1 to 10 what JCI Hong Kong has done this year from the beginning of the year to now.

NP: I would say it is 9 points, the only point we didn't not achieve is that I still hope we can be closer to the members' voices, and we think there is a room for improvement in this position. For other things such as the degree of hard work, we have already done our best. During the post-pandemic era, there are a lot of things that need to be reconnected. This also requires a lot of determination, effort and time as well.

For the improvement that I mentioned, we have also tried to hold a town hall meeting that allowed us to update our latest news and collect everyone's opinions. It is a relatively interactive event, giving members the opportunity to speak.



### Q: Could you share with us your motto?

NP: "Fight hard, no regrets" is my motto since I entered the university. To me, regret is more tragic than failure. Therefore, no matter what challenges you are facing, please remember that there are several keys to success: these are whether you have seized the opportunity, whether you have done your best, and never give up.

# INTERVIEW WITH SPONSOR

# JCI Hong Kong National Executive Vice President Senator Lucy Jiang



### Q. Why is the company name "WSpace+"?

The name "WSpace+" was chosen for our training business office based on several key factors. Firstly, the "W" in WSpace+represents a serial concepts:

**WE**: symbolizing our goal of gathering tutors and speakers who share a similar vision.

**WEALTH:** signifies that our academy offers more than just financial training courses; we also emphasize the importance of personal growth and spiritual development.

**WINNING**: reflects our aspiration to provide knowledge that empowers participants to succeed in their business and career endeavours.

### Q: What motivated you to become a trainer?

Having encountered numerous selfless tutors in the past who willingly shared their knowledge, I gained valuable insights and experienced personal growth as a result. This made me realize that sharing knowledge is a special talent, and I felt compelled to pass on what I had learned to others, enabling them to develop and thrive.

# Q: Has COVID-19 had a negative impact on your company's business? How did you address the challenges and turn crises into opportunities?

COVID-19 significantly affected our business, especially since we previously relied on physical training methods. The transition to online platforms presented numerous challenges; however, it also provided an opportunity for growth. We adapted by acquiring new skills such as conducting Facebook Live sessions, virtual training, and hosting Zoom meetings. Even after the pandemic, online training and meetings have become commonplace, offering participants the flexibility to choose between physical and virtual options. This has also allowed us to overcome geographical limitations and hold training sessions overseas.

# Q: Did the shift from physical to online teaching make participants feel distanced from one another?

While there was initially some perceived distance, it was not as significant as anticipated. For example, one of our courses required a two-day physical training session involving various interactive games. However, due to the uncertainty surrounding the duration of the fifth wave of the pandemic, we decided to try



a fully online version. We introduced innovative approaches such as requesting participants to use two devices—one for group discussions and another for listening to the speaker. We also incorporated new tools for exercises, pre-course technique learning, and additional icebreaking game sessions. These measures created a sense of interaction and enjoyment for participants. Ultimately, the online version proved to be approximately 90% as effective as the fully physical version. Surprisingly, some participants even preferred the online format because it addressed the issue of unclear audio in a traditional classroom setting, especially for those seated at the back.

# Q: How does your position as NEVP in JCI provide you with a different perspective on the world?

As the supervisor of International Affairs in JCI, my role allows me to engage with JC members from various locations, offering a unique opportunity to expand my network. Since the relaxation of social distancing restrictions, we have hosted receptions for visiting JC members from other countries and facilitated their participation in inaugural ceremonies of JC chapters associated with different religions. These interactions and events have provided us with numerous opportunities to connect with young leaders from around the world. I firmly believe that these connections and opportunities can lead to future projects, exchange tours, and collaborations that not only benefit my business but also contribute to my JCI career.
