

AN INTERVIEW WITH

Dr. Sandy LauAmbassador of Community Development Project - "Care for Left-behind Elderly"



Matthew: Hello Sandy. Nice to meet you. Could you briefly introduce yourself?

Sandy: I was born in Hong Kong, and after having gained some international experience, I'm dedicated to improving my home town for the next generation. I studied in the UK for more than a decade and graduated from University College London, majoring in Economics. After that, I joined Goldman Sachs' graduate program before participating in the 2009 Miss Hong Kong Pageant, which I was lucky enough to win. Part of the mission of Miss Hong Kong is to support charitable work and to promote Hong Kong, so I joined Wai Yin Association, a charitable organisation formed by past Miss Hong Kong over 40 years ago. I served the Association for 10 years and was honoured to be elected as the President of the Association for 4 of those years. During my term, I initiated different types of projects such as the "Care for elderly" campaign, where we visited elderly homes with mental health specialists. The campaign helped to raise awareness of potential mental health issues and how to address these. In Hong Kong, the depression rate among the elderly population is high. Generally, the population is ageing so more people are facing pressure and challenges after retirement, elderly people who live alone are amongst those who suffer the

most from these issues. I think this elderly campaign from JCI Queensway is very meaningful, and I am delighted to extend my support since this is a cause I deeply care about.

Matthew: Can you let us know a bit more about you and your work?

Sandy: I co-founded two charitable organizations called Mindful Mandarins Foundation and the London Ball Foundation. What drove me to establish Mindful Mandarins was a sense of cultural belonging. I moved to study in the UK for many years when I was still young, before I felt I had mastered Chinese Culture and language. So I understand the importance of learning in early childhood to help with one's Chinese fluency and knowledge, and

by extension to develop cultural confidence. We work with teachers that are experts in teaching kindergartens kids, using our tailor-made teaching materials and curriculums to provide ten-week Mandarin and Chinese culture courses to kindergartens as part of their curriculum. In addition to our courses in schools, we also run a program that teaches university students to teach ethnic minority children Mandarin and Chinese Culture.

The London Ball Foundation hosted the 2024 Education Summit at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and it was designed to convene some of the world's most influential educator and industry leaders. Our ultimate goal is to provide a platform for the distinguished alumni networks and encourage talents to return to the city to educate, invest, work and invent for the future generations. One of our key initiatives is called the "My Dream Program". It aims to expose young teenagers to a diverse range of career paths, fostering a sense of exploration and encouraging thoughtful consideration of their future vocations according to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) as a guidance on how to contribute to the world. Participating students engaged in research on SDGs, writing tasks

and presentations. We presented the pupils with awards and networking opportunities within our alumni networks to assist them to achieve their own dreams. And last year, I was pleased to see the impact of these initiatives recognized, when I was awarded as one of the Ten Outstanding Young Persons in Hong Kong. I will continue to contribute to society through these two charities and other meaningful causes that may need my help. That is one of the reasons I am proud to be the ambassador for the current JCI Queensway elderly program.











Jasmine: We believe many people in Hong Kong are having a lot of challenges in taking care of the elderly people. Do you have any particular suggestions on how to tackle the difficulties?

Sandy: It certainly is a challenge that affects many of our families and communities in Hong Kong. I was very touched by some of the stories from the elderly program I initiated in Wai Yin. As well as donations we have made to elderly centers to support their medical program and equipment purchasing, we also provided a rehabilitation bus for the use of point-to point transportation for disadvantaged and sick elderly people in the community. We also launched the "Elderly Healthcare Education Program", a series of public seminars to equip the caretakers with knowledge and tips in caring for their elder family members. Another project "On My Way Home 2017" provided free mobile link service to deprived elderly with dementia. We supported and fundraised for the center to complete their renovation and equipment installation, this center provides a lifelong learning platform for the retired elderly to develop their interests and social networks to enrich their retired life and reduced the potential mental health problem.

All in all, we should all spend more time and love to care for our elderly people to help them maintain good physical and mental health.

Jasmine: Do you have any advice for the elderly people or how do you think the elderly people should maintain a healthy body and good mental health?

Sandy: One of the volunteer programs of Lingnan University is to recruit university students to teach elderly people to use online platform like FaceTime, to chat with their family members. I think this is a great idea because I believe that lifelong learning is crucial to maintain a healthy mind, and being able to see and speak to those you love and care about can make them happier overall. And research shows that people who remain active are more likely to keep a sharp mind and strong memory for longer.

Matthew: And how could the youngsters connect with the elderly people?

Sandy: Youngsters should start their practice at home, to care for their seniors at home. If time permits, of course, volunteers to work around elderly services are always needed. Take the initiative to reach out to the local elderly population; spend time to communicate and share stories with each other. Youngsters can really benefit from learning from the rich life stories and personal experiences of older people.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

"CARE FOR LEFT BEHIND ELDERLY"

This year, JCI Queensway has been aiming to support for the "Left Behind Elderly", who are 60 and above with sons and daughters or immediate caregivers who have emigrated or working for long periods of time outside of Hong Kong. The sense of loss after a close acquaintance has moved away heavily affects their mental and physical health.



On March 17, we held our Opening Ceremony cum Yum Cha Fun Day. It was a huge success, boasting attendance of over 75 elderly people, 20 students, and 30 volunteers and coverage by 5 different news outlets. With inspiring speeches from our Project Advisor Dr Hon Frankie NGAN Man-yu, and Project Ambassador 2023 Ten Outstanding Young Persons Awardee Dr. Sandy Lau, the event kicked off a series of events to benefit the Left Behind Elderly.



In partnership with Ngau Tau Kok Kai Fong Welfare Association, we conducted 2 home visits in search of hidden left behind elderly people on February 24 and

May 11 in order to connect these elderlies with

community supports. On June 8, we conducted our first technology workshop in cooperation with Christian Services, to teach the elderly people how to use their mobiles for communication with their overseas family and for everyday life improvements.



In collaboration with the Hong Kong Polytechnic University's Research Centre for Gerontology and Family Studies we have now launched a survey with questionnaire with the aim of understanding the mental health of the left behind elderly people, with the research to be released during a press conference on August 10, 2024.

Our aim is to increase awareness of the left behind elderly people and provide them with the necessary support within the community. Please stay tuned and participate in our future activities for the less fortunate members of our community.





COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (Continued)

On August 11, 2024, JCI Queensway hosted a press release to announce the findings of research on the mental health status and needs of left-behind elderly individuals in the community conducted over June and July. In partnership with the Hong Kong Polytechnic University Research Centre for Gerontology and Family Studies (RCGFS),112 responses were received.

We were honoured to have our results endorsed by a panel of esteemed guests and representatives from the three groups of our community: the government, academia, and community. They include:

- Guest of Honor, Dr. Hon Dik Chi Yuen, SBS, JP, legislative council member
- Research Partner, Dr Xinxin Cai, Research Assistant Professor of RCGFS
- Miss Ann Chan, Supervisor of Caritas Hong Kong
- Mr. Ben Mak, National President of Junior Chamber International Hong Kong

There were many concerning figures from our report: 26% of respondents exhibited signs of moderate to severe depression, suggesting further need for screening. Unfortunately, 33% of respondents stated that they are unwilling to actively seek external help.

To support their cause, JCI Queensway hosted a Youth and Elderly Sports Day to accomplish our three goals set at the beginning of the project. Overall 30 elders, 10 youths, and 20+ volunteers participated in the exciting press conference and sports day.

We were fortunate to have attracted over 60 news outlets located in Hong Kong, Mainland, and overseas. Please stay tuned as more exciting events will be hosted to ensure sustainable support for our Left-Behind Elderly.


