Transforming through Passion and Satisfaction – Connecting with Hong Kong's Top Middle-Distance Runner

In the third issue of *Harbour Light*, Mr. Chan Ka-ho, Hong Kong's top middle distance runner, shared his insight on running. Many readers crave more from Mr. Chan, a bright star shined in the 10-km event in Standard Chartered Hong Kong Marathon 2017. An interesting fact to note is, if he had not started running, he would have been a gangster. So how did running change his life?



Q: Why did you start running?

I started running when I was 16 years old. When I was younger, I found playing football was more exciting. It is in fact the sense of achievement moved my focus from football to running. During my high school life, I won medals in both 1500-meter and 3000-meter races. Later I went practising with my schoolmates, Sometimes I had to travel from Tai Po to Tsing Yi just for training.

Q: How can running change one's life?

In fact running has trained not only my endurance, but also perseverance. Running can also help transform students' lives and ignite their passion. Some teenagers can go astray easily. They hang out with gangs. Some of them are even night-drifters. It is crucial for them to develop a habit which can bring changes to their lives.

Q: What is the most memorable moment in your running career?

Actually there are plenty of memorable moments in my running career. In 2006, I joined the half marathon held in Osaka. In the middle of the race, it snowed. Although it was really challenging, I eventually made it and broke the Hong Kong record.

Another most memorable moment in my running career is that in 20016, I joined another marathon in North Pole. This was really a precious chance since only 50 people around the world can join this contest. Coincidently it was my birthday. We had a birthday celebration with a birthday cake in the Nordic world.







Q: As a professional sportsman, do you follow a strict diet?

Actually I always feel that I'm not just a professional sportsman. I'm also an ordinary person. I also like buffet and hotpot. Food is a kind of relief. But before any competition, I would observe strictly on my intake of carbohydrates, salt and oil.

My wife Christy also helps me a lot on maintaining a balanced diet. She also gives an array of useful advice on nutrition as she is an expert on that field. She would sometimes ask me take some more fruits as it contains a lot of anti-oxidants. She will also supply me with abundant health supplements to ensure that I have all the vitamins needed.

Q: Nowadays many Hong Kongers join half-marathons or marathons. Any advice for them?

I would say it is a good trend for Hong Kongers to become more health conscious. Meanwhile, they also have to be very cautious. Marathon is a long-distance running. Rome can't be built by just a day. They shouldn't start running for a few weeks and then go for marathon races. They should do it slowly and start from shorter distances like 5 kilometers or even 10 milometers. After you have achieved that, aim higher next time and strive for better performance.



Beyond Belive – Interview with National President Senator Ronald KAN

Everyone in JCIHK should have known Senator Ronald KAN – our National President. Apart from his professional and extensive knowledge in law, he has also worked jointly and closely with the government and various professional organizations in striving for a better future for Hong Kong, as well as our future generation.

It may surprise some of our young readers - National President Senator Ronald Kan was also our National Assigned Executive Officer in 2013! Let's hear some of his thoughts on JCI Queensway!

Q: When did you start getting closer connection with JCI Queensway?

I believe the moment came when I was appointed as the National Assigned Executive Officer of JCI Queensway in 2013. That year I worked closely with Past President Leo Ng. That is also one of most memorable moments I spent with JCI Queensway. I enjoyed the moment to chill with Past President Leo so much after meetings. It's genuinely 'work hard, play hard'.

Q: What is your feeling towards JCI Queensway?

JCI Queensway is always a very warm family in my eyes. Everyone here is well connected with one another. Hearts are connected not merely because of chapter affairs or projects, but also through various gatherings. Such kinship is precious and makes JCI Queensway unique. I hope this tradition will be passed on from one generation to another.





Q: Regarding the plan of JCIHK in 2018, we know that retention is a key element. Would you mind sharing more on this idea with us?

We noticed that many of our members usually gain and learn a lot in the first year in JC; however, they start feeling that they can't further their learning after one to three years. Actually it's a rather pathetic phenomenon since we have provided so many resources on training and grooming our future leaders. We hope that they can stay. We hope that they can fine-tune their learning and groom another next generation of future leaders.

Hence, this year we are hosting coaching classes. We hope that through coaching classes our members, especially executive committees of different chapters can be equipped with skills of unlocking others' potentials. We also hope that these skills can also help our members at their workplace. We hope our members to understand that at every stage of their JC journey, they can learn and be equipped with different skills which are useful not only in our organization, but also in their lives.

Q: 2017 was a fruitful year for JCI Queensway. How can we achieve more in 2018?

As I have mentioned before, JCI Queensway is always a warm family. I can see there are a lot of outstanding members here. We have many energetic young members joining JCI Queensway.
